### TEACHER SLIDE

- This lesson focuses on addressing the misuse of language in schools.
- By exploring the true meaning of words that are used and the discussing when/ if they are appropriate to use.
- You will require post it notes/ scrap paper and the 'heart' print out.

Inappropriate means something that is not suitable or proper for a certain situation, place, or time.

It's when behaviour, words, or actions don't fit what's expected or accepted, and might make others feel uncomfortable, upset, or offended.

Activity	Description	Timing
Introduction	Ask students to complete the 'do it now' task. (they need to keep hold of their post it note for later in the lesson). Introduce learning objectives and revisit class agreements.	5 minutes
Definition of inappropriate language	Read ou the definitions of inappropriate language. Set behaviour expectations for the session.	5 mins
Discussion	Discuss why it's important to think before we speak?	5 minutes
Discussion	Use this time to discuss the examples of inappropriate language that have been selected either in small groups or as one large group.  The examples given are: Gay, Spaz and Paedo- It is important for students to understand the meaning of the words they use.  Feel free to swap out, or add any extra words that you hear or have heard used in your school/ setting.	15 minutes
Heart activity	This activity requires the handout, cut a heart for each student. Writing their names on the hearts and then crumpling them up is a visual for the long term hurt damage caused by name calling or inappropriate language.	10 minutes
Video	Watch this short video about the use of inappropriate language in school	5 minutes
Reflection/ signposting	Write down three things that students can do to help them think before they speak

## RECAP

Each time someone names a hurtful word or action, wrinkle or fold the heart a little bit.




#### **ACTIVITY**


