

TEACHER SLIDE

- This lesson focuses on GROUP CHATS, including the positives and negatives of using them, digital wellbeing, online bullying and inappropriate content.
- The final slide also provides a signpost to the learning for next week, if you follow the lessons in sequence.
- This lesson includes discussion-based activities but requires some handouts.





A group chat is a type of online communication where multiple people can participate in a single conversation thread simultaneously.


Activity	Description	Timing
Introduction	Ask students to complete the 'do it now' task.This task requires a printed handout. Introduce learning objectives and revisit class agreements.	5 minutes
Age restrictions	Students should discuss the age restrictions on some commonly used chat apps, and identify the reasons WHY chat apps have an age restriction.	5 mins
Positives and negatives	Students should discuss 'chat scenarios' in small groups- prompted by the questions on each slide. This can be done as a full class or in small groups.	15/20 mins
Issues and solutions	This activity requires printed handouts. Each small group should have one chat- they should annotate the paper, using one colour to identify problems with the chat, and another colour to identify any solutions. facilitate a group discussion, where each small group can feedback to the rest of the class. OR rotate the paper around the groups, so that all students have the opportunity to see all the 'chat scenarios'.	15 minutes
Mind map	Use the whiteboard to create a mind map about creating safer chats. This can include: not adding people you don't know, using do not disturb function, turn off read receipts etc.	10 minutes
Reflection/ signposting	Ask students to reflect on this lesson - what can they do to address iapnpropriate behaviour in a group chat?	5 minutes














